(Formerly Tri City Homeless Coalition)

588 Brown Road

They have been active for 20 years.

Sixty -six people may live there for up to 3 months -- men, women & children.

Our concern is the Federal Emergency Shelter Grant Program has denied a grant for \$267,195<sup>00</sup> for the 2 years in financial support to the 66 bed facility.

Without this funding, Abode may have to close the shelter from 10 AM to 6 PM , which would make it useless to residents who work night jobs and sleep during the day.

Another result may be to eliminate eight full-time positions and close four homes for families transitioning from homelessness in Hayward.

There will be a Behind the Scenes Tour of the Sunrise Village Emergency Shelter on Wednesday's, February 10 and 17 from 1 - 2 PM at 588 Brown Road.

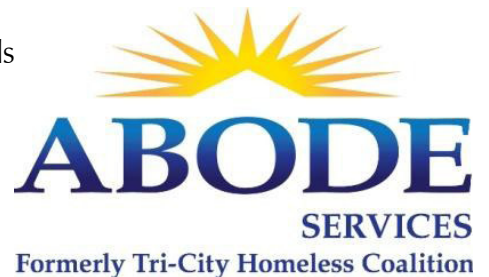
